There is still time to get signed up for high speed **broadband Internet**! They are offering connection speeds of 100Mb to 1Gb (1000Mb). Signing up ahead of time with GorgeNet or LSNetworks will get you connected with no connection fees. After July 1, that will cost \$100 for most connections, depending on your distance from the nearest fiber line. The backbone from the BPA substation to Maupin is done and the cell towers are connected. The technology hut inside the city reservoir yard is wired and outfitted. The in-town work came in way over budget. With some "value engineering" and taking advantage of conduit already in place, it will go out to bid again so that work can begin in the next few weeks. At the latest, it will be available for connections near the end of July.

We are working with other small cities in Wasco and Sherman Counties to coordinate the hiring of a Code Enforcement/Nuisance Abatement Officer. This would be a contract position that handles those duties for a group of 4-8 small cities. The person would have the proper training to deal with the duties and finally give us a way to properly enforce those ordinances.
